OTHER INITIATIVES

1. Joint Education Sessions: Two sessions (June 7th & 12th) were hosted by Worksafe BC in Delta and Abbotsford and attended by CVSE, ESB, RCMP, FLC's and Producers.
 2. MOU - ESB, MOT, Agriculture, Worksafe BC and BCAC are currently revising the MOU signed in 2005. This will reinforce the cooperation between the enforcement agencies as well as strengthen the support within the BC Agriculture sector.
 3. FLC lists - Worksafe, MOT, and ESB each keep their own list of current FLC's. At present the lists have some overlap but are not the same. To ensure an accurate, complete and up to date list of FLC, the agencies will cooperate and compare lists to ensure all FLC's are accounted for, reduce overlap, increase overall accuracy.
 4. Joint Enforcement Measures - Worksafe, CVSE and ESB have planned joint inspections at agriculture worksites as a pilot for July and August. Four dates are selected. At the end of each day, the agencies will meet to discuss the positives/negatives of the joint enforcement. This information will be used in deciding modifications required to current practice and next steps.
 5. The Employment Standards Branch increased the Agriculture Compliance team from 4 to 6 staff, effective 1 June 2007
 6. Worksafe has advertised for an additional 4 positions, expected to be filled for September
 7. ESB Regulation Change came into effect 2 July 2007, requiring FLC's to post the seatbelt requirement, visible to all occupants of the vehicle. These posters were distributed to FLC's via mail. As FLC licences are renewed, the FLC will receive a laminated version of the poster.
 8. Changes to the FLC licencing process are modified to incorporate the signing of a waiver, giving the ESB access to compliance information held by ICBC/Motor Vehicle Branch, Worksafe, and CVSE.
